INSTRUCTIONS FOR STALLION LICENCE APPLICATION.

Please note: From 15th July 2021 The British Palomino Society is only able to licence stallions owned by a member (adult) of the society and registered with the society and kept in the UK. Details of how to join and register are available at

www.thebritishpalominosociety.co.uk

Please note The British Palomino Society is a colour society and under DEFRA regulations we are unable to put the breeding of any animal in any passport we issue whether the parents are registered or licenced with us or not.

Please:

- Complete the identification form describing the horse's markings carefully and accurately.
- Return with the fee of £150 (for stallion licence only) to the address found on the contact page of the website. If membership and registration required, the cost of these is in addition to the stallion licence fee. If the stallion has been registered with us prior to 15 July 2021, a DNA colour test will be required at the cost of an additional £25.
- **Include a copy of the horse's passport.**
- The office will forward the necessary forms to your appointed Veterinary Surgeon. No fees will be refunded if the stallion fails the veterinary examination.)

EXAMINATION OF THE STALLION (Minimum age 24 months)

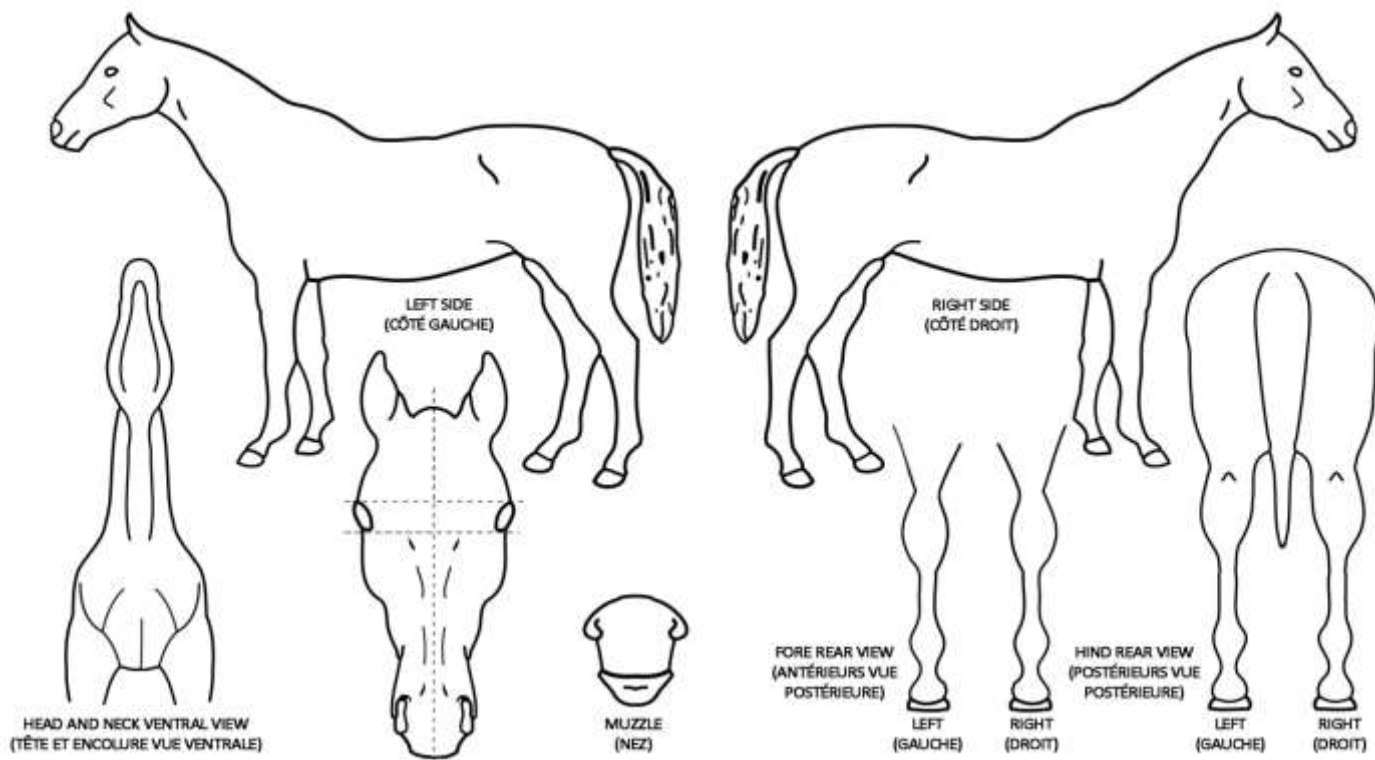
- Before the issue of a licence is considered, a Veterinary Surgeon will examine the stallion to ensure it is of a minimum standard in respect of certain conditions.
- On completion of his / her examination, the Veterinary Surgeon will return the examination papers directly to the British Palomino Society together with a mane / tail sample which will then be sent away for DNA analysis.

PREPARATION OF THE STALLION FOR EXAMINATION

- Applicants are advised that the Veterinary Surgeon is unlikely to examine any stallion found to be unmanageable.
- Unbroken stallions presented for examination should be handleable and have been lunged daily for a number of days prior to examination.

ISSUING OF LICENCES

- Subject to a satisfactory report from the Veterinary Surgeon, the British Palomino Society will issue the Licence.
- Generally speaking, a Licence remains in force until the stallion dies, provided it remains in the same ownership.
- The sale of the stallion will require re-issue of the Licence in the name of the new owner, who should apply to the British Palomino Society within four weeks of the purchase, enclosing the existing Licence.
- Should the stallion be exported, the Vendor should inform the Society immediately and return the Licence.

Directions for completing the form – Type or print neatly & return the form to the Society

1. The horse must be microchipped by a Veterinary Surgeon. The completed descriptive must be accurate and meet all FEI guidelines. If it is completed by a competent person, not a vet, then this must be done prior to any microchip implant as your vet must sign to confirm that the description is a true representation of the animal he/she is microchipping.
2. The hair for the DNA Test must be taken by a Veterinary Surgeon. Forms for DNA Test can be downloaded from the website.
3. Enclose six (6) good quality photographs taken in good light of the **complete view** of the animal on hard ground (two from each side, one from the front and one from the rear) 15cm x 10cm. Computer printouts will be accepted but only if they are clear, not distorted in any way and are printed onto good quality glossy/matt photographic paper only.
4. Each photograph must have the D.O.B of the animal and the name of Sire and Dam written on the back.
5. Enclose the correct with cheque / postal order made payable to The British Palomino Society or proof of direct payment into the Society's bank account -
6. **We strongly recommend:**
 1. **You keep a copy of the entire application form in case of postal loss.**
 2. **You send your application to The Registrar by Special Delivery Guaranteed post**

Fees: £150 for licence. If registered with the BPS prior 1 July 2021 add £25 for DNA colour test.

LEGAL RESPONSIBILITIES FOR OWNERS

The owner of an Equine (horse, pony or donkey) has specific legal responsibilities under the Horse Passport Regulations 2009. Failing to comply may mean that the local authority (usually Trading Standards) takes enforcement action. The maximum penalty for each offence is £5000

APPLYING FOR PASSPORTS

Any equine must be microchipped by a vet before a passport can be applied for.

The owner must apply for a passport from an authorised Passport Issuing Organisation (PIO) before a foal is 6 months old or before the 31 December of the year of birth, whichever is the later. Failure to do so is an offence.

KEEPING AN EQUINE

Once a passport is issued – keep it safe. A Trading Standards Animal Health Officer may request it to be produced for inspection at any time

The passport should accompany the animal when it moves around including to shows, sales, competitions, when it is sold or moves to slaughter.

Keep a note of the passport number and the PIO it was issued by. This makes obtaining a replacement more straight forward if the original is ever damaged, destroyed or lost as the passport is valid for the life of the horse.

It is an offence to apply for a duplicate passport for an equine unless the original is lost, destroyed or damaged and in such cases a duplicate must be sought within 30 days.

Passports must be returned to the issuing PIO following death of any equine within 30 days of death to enable the passport to be invalidated.

Administration by a vet of all prohibited veterinary medication will be recorded in section ix part iii if the equine has not been signed out of the human food chain.

In addition, an equine can be signed out of the human food chain at any time by an owner, keeper, PIO or Veterinarian.

SELLING AN EQUINE

When a horse, pony or donkey is sold the passport must be passed on to the new owner with an accompanying signed transfer of ownership form. The new owner then has 30 days to comply with the Law by transferring ownership with the issuing PIO.

BUYING AN EQUINE

On purchase of any equine always obtain and inspect the passport thoroughly and make sure you obtain a signed transfer of ownership to enable you to notify a change of ownership with the issuing PIO within 30 days. In the case of The British Palomino Society you will need to send the completed form, the equine passport and the correct fee to the PIO (address is in bold print on the front of all forms).
